### Integration of the Roma people

## Elim Second Hand

Before the month of September ended, FCE Second Hand shop finally opened. It is located in the building where the car and carpet wash used to be. A new entrance has been built and the building renovated both inside and out, due to the damage from all the water over the years. The location of the shop is very good. It is on a busy street and close to the centre of the town.

The goods come from Sweden and furniture is especially appreciated. There are many second hand shops in Marghita which sell clothes but good secondhand furniture is difficult to find. The employees take care of the goods, price it and prepare it for the shop. The days when the second hand shop is open, the employees are kept busy taking care of customers and selling goods.

## Hygiene Centre

It is being built in the Roma community and will include six showers, seven toilets and two washing mashines. This will benefit all the people who live in the area where they don't have running water in their homes.

This is a step in the right direction to improve quality of life and a bigger possibility to help these marginalised people intergrate into society.

## More projects

Adriana Crişan has been employed by FCE since 2009. Previously, she was a fosterparent in FCE. She explains that she used to visit the orphanage in Popesti. The children always came running to hug her and she thought that she would like to work there and take care of them. That didn't happen, but when her sister Neli started working at the Special Needs school in Marghita, she often went there to visit. When FCE opened the halfway home 'Brânduşă', she was employed there.

"I worked only weekends for the first five years at Brânduşă and I loved it from the very first day! There were thirty six young adults from the beginning. I was wondering how it would all work out when many of them were of a similar age to me. However, we got along very well and I enjoyed our conversations.

During the first years, the young adults only lived at Brânduşă for a relatively short period of time (2 years) before they were then considered ready to move out. Today they can live there for an unlimited time. It is very nice to meet those who now have a place of their own and are doing well. I hope all those who are able to can achieve this.

They liked it when we cooked together and I was able to teach them how to make pancakes, doughnuts and preserves for the winter. During the last six months, I was studying and also started to work at FCE Day Centre and in 2015, I started to work full-time at the Day Centre."

Adriana talks passionately about how much the project at Brândușă and the Day Centre have meant and mean for the young adults with special needs. For the ones attending FCE Day Centre, it is their only chance to have a social life and purposeful days.

"The parents of the young people with severe disabilities are extremely thankful. They do not get any support from anywhere else and they cannot leave their child alone for even five minutes so it feels good for us that we can provide this for them.

One of the boys cannot participate in many activities but he comes for a few hours every day and enjoys being together with the other young people. We make cards and candles but mix that with other activities that are included in the specific guidelines. This can be discussions about current subjects or mathematics and writing which we do regularly. We eat breakfast and lunch together at the Day Centre and they take turns helping to set the table and wash up. Once a month we celebrate birthdays. When we have break time, they like to be on the swings!"

One part of Adriana's work is to write documentation, reports and other paperwork. Since March this year, she is also responsible for the FCE catering kitchen where five women are employed. They make food (soup and main course) for the family homes, Brândușă, special needs school and After School.

During the Autumn, FCE employees have given a huge amount of cabbage, potatoes, carrots and tomatoes to the FCE catering kitchen. The

kitchen staff have pickled the cabbage for the winter. To further reduce costs, we have started baking bread in the catering kitchen. The children in the Special Needs School and After School project receives a loaf of bread every weekday to take home which is a good help for these families.

The FCE employees are remarkable everyday heroes who fight for vulnerable people to be noticed and given tools in order to have a better life!
